Cristostomo has received multiple awards and recognition in his career thus far, including the 2019 Student's Choice Outstanding Staff Award at UWT and the TRIO Emerging Leader Award while working at Metropolitan Development Council. Cristostomo has worked in the high school-to-college field for over 20 years and was a co-founder of Tacoma's cutting-edge nonprofit urban arts organization, Fab-5.

His years of front-line experience preparing students for college success, deeply rooted community perspective, and robust understanding of public higher education uniquely positions him to lead Ready to Rise forward as we continue to refine the model and build a sustainable program that will serve hundreds of students into the future," said Tim Herron, CEO at Degrees of Change.

Cristotomo's hiring comes as Ready to Rise begins its third year of the five-year grant program funded by College Spark Washington. With a goal of serving 1,000 students over five years, Ready to Rise was developed to provide a scalable model of cohort-based leadership development and college support, drawing on the successful Act Six model—a scholarship program serving underrepresented leaders attending private liberal arts colleges that has demonstrated exceptional graduation rates and leadership outcomes for participants.

Simply put, I am honored and eager to get to work with Degrees of Change. The communities I come from and the family I proudly represent equally share my excitement with what is to come," said Cristostomo.
